



GWU Honors Director Lusardi for Leadership and Impact

Based on her distinguished academic career and impact on the field of financial literacy, Anna Lusardi, founder and academic director of the Global Financial Literacy Excellence Center, has been recognized by the George Washington University with the highest faculty position—University Professor.

Director Lusardi has a stellar research record and is a recognized leader in the field of financial literacy. She pioneered the research that has established reliable measures of financial literacy, and these measures are now the backbone of numerous surveys around the world. Her scholarship has helped to establish financial literacy as a field of study, uncovered global trends, identified the groups who are most vulnerable to being financially illiterate, and demonstrated the impact of financial literacy on behavior. Her work is contributing to broader societal awareness of the crisis of financial illiteracy and the need for action.

"It is gratifying when a scholar is able to impact the foundations of knowledge while also applying their work to address grand challenges in society. Dr. Lusardi sets the mold for this type of scholar, and exemplifies the stature that we aspire to for our University Professors.
